BII is the development finance arm of the UK government, and invests \$1.5 billion a year in Africa and South Asia in projects ranging from agribusiness and energy, to health care and information technology. Sir Graham will discuss the challenges and rewards of trying to promote economic development in some of the world's poorest countries. We will look at some concrete BII projects and discuss the role of private investment in health care, clean energy and more.

The reasons for this have not been fully investigated but cannot be attributed solely to hesitancy. At this seminar, Reuben Visiting Fellow Dr Donald Palmer will discuss his research on the impact of age on immune function and how this led to developing tailored messaging when engaging with various communities.


